

<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We endeavor to teach and preach sound doctrine - “For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but..heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; and they shall turn away [their] ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables. [2Tim 4:3-4]</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We don’t count on a pre-tribulation rapture - Most churches have found it people pleasing to tell fables, e.g. that we will miss the testing that is coming, which will separate those that love the truth from the worldly. Beware, when the tribulation does start and we didn't get taken away yet, they will say: “...My lord delayeth His coming; and shall begin to beat the menservants and maidens, and to eat and drink, and to be drunken.” [Luke 12:45]</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We have not added or taken away from the scriptures - Touch not, taste not, handle not, Let no man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of an holyday, or of the new moon, or of the sabbath <i>days</i>: (Col 2:16) commanding to abstain from meats,, [Col 2:20-23, 2:15-17, I Tim 4:3]. God will deal with those that add or take away from His Word [Rev 22:18-19]. One example is taking the view of some that say the world wasn’t created in an actual six days, detracting from the power/word of God. [Gen 2:2-3] The vegetables, flowers and fruit trees couldn’t have waited a thousand years for the bees and other pollinators to show up.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We have not turned the grace of the only one true God, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob into lasciviousness (permission to sin) - [Jude 1:4]. There is a difference between stumbling and continuing in sin.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We have not changed the fear of God into just a reverence for God - “The fear of God is the beginning of wisdom, “...The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life to depart from the snares of death”, “Serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear: for our God is a consuming fire”, and “it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.” [Psalm 111:10, Proverbs 14:27, Deuteronomy 5:29, Hebrew 12:28-29, Hebrew 10:31]</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>We remind our congregation that Jesus said - “I am the vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch that beareth not fruit he taketh away.” [John 15:1-2], “and ye shall be hated of all [men] for my name's sake: but he that endureth to the end shall be saved.”[Mat 10:22]</p>
